

Set up Microsoft Remote Desktop on Mac

Prerequisites

- An internet connection.
- A device running MacOS

Assumptions

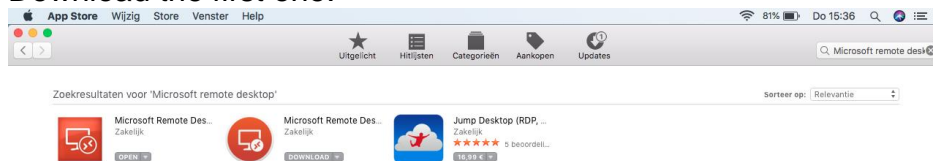
Step-by-step guide

1. Download Microsoft Remote Desktop from the App Store

1. Open the app store by clicking this icon.



2. Search for 'Microsoft Remote Desktop'
3. Download the first one.



2. Open Microsoft remote desktop

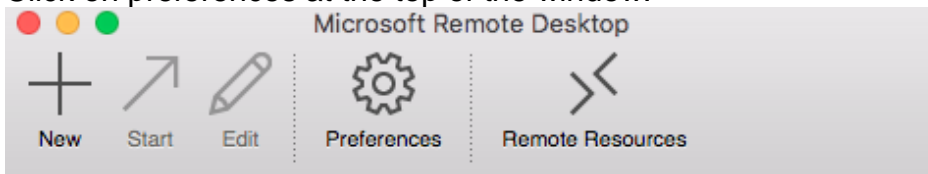
1. Click the launchpad icon



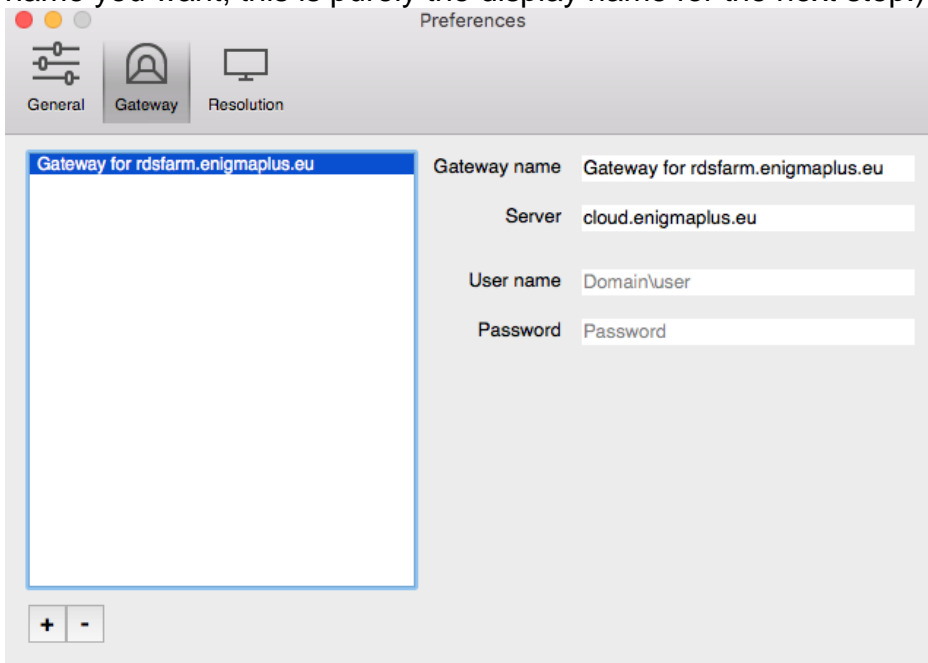
2. Click on the Microsoft Remote Desktop icon.



- Click on preferences at the top of the window.




- Go to gateway and click the + icon at the bottom left of the window.
- Enter the correct gateway details for the organisation. (You can choose any name you want, this is purely the display name for the next step.)



- Close the window. Your new gateway gets saved automatically.
- Click the big + icon at the top left of the window to create a new remote desktop connection.
- Enter a connection name. This name is free to choose.

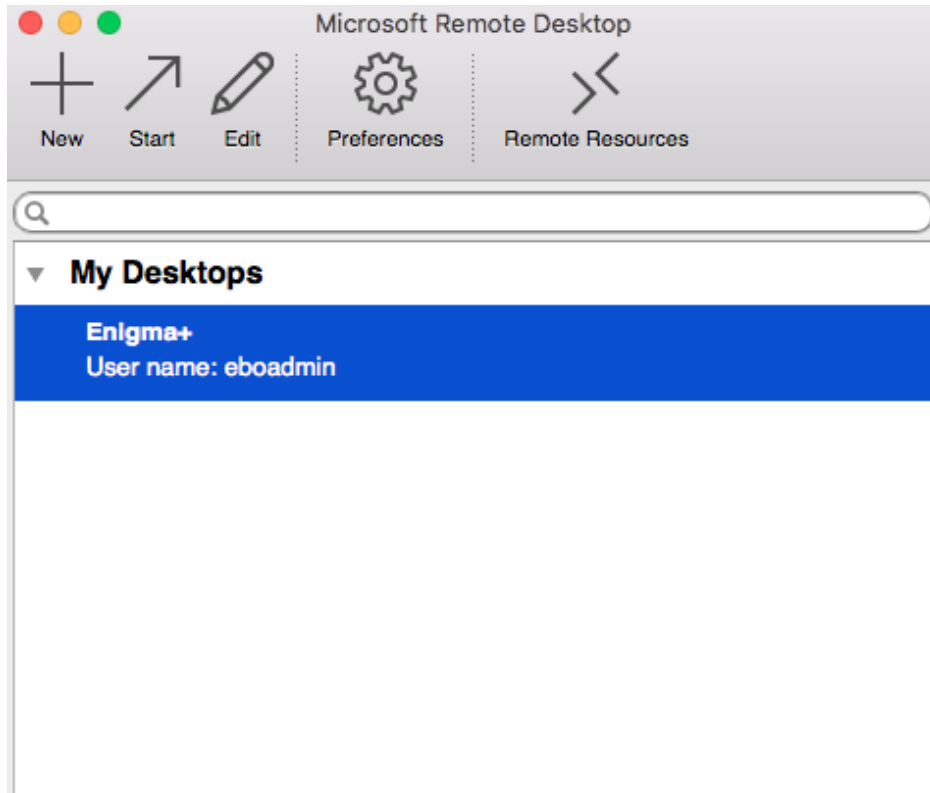
9. Enter the name or IP address of the PC or server you are trying to connect to.

10. Optionally you can enter a username and password. If you leave these fields blank, you will be prompted for user credentials each time you try to make a connection.
11. Leave the rest of the settings as they are.
12. Close the window. Your Inputs will be saved automatically.
13. Open the new connection by selecting it and clicking start at the top of the window.
